Established in 2010 as the Centre for Research in Evidence-Based Practice (CREBP) we have now transitioned into the Institute for Evidence-Based Healthcare in 2019.

The transition from Centre to Institute will give us greater ability to provide advisory services that will help people think about ways to provide sustainable, evidence-based healthcare, and how research can better inform policy and practice.

The Institute will continue to deliver world-class research, engagement and training that will serve as a national and international resource for scholars, clinicians, system leaders, patients and families in the implementation of evidence-based clinical care.

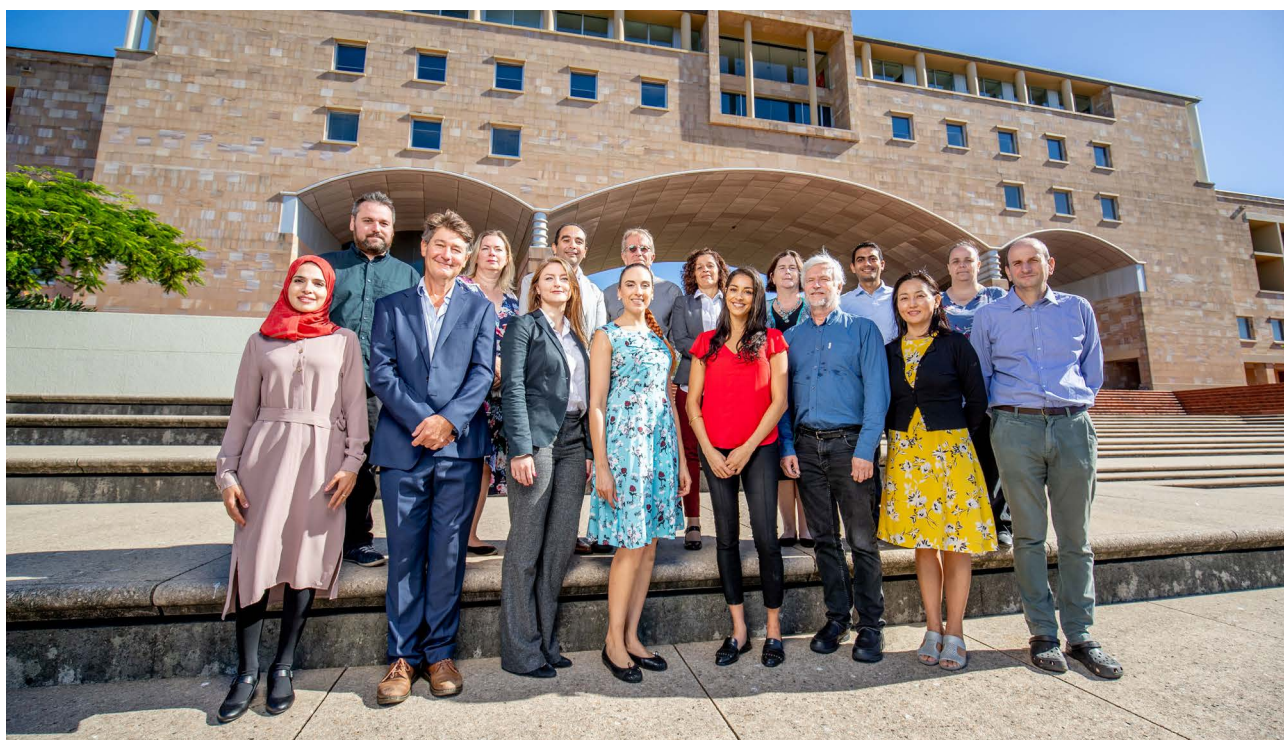
